

## Creating Personalized Learning Goals (page 1 of 2)

The purpose of this chart (on the next page) is to help you plan for variations in learning goals or lesson objectives for students. Typically, if a student is performing at a level not consistent with the current grade, official documentation may be required to alter learning goals to reflect the student's current performance level. However, as many curriculum documents outline learning goals in broad language, it could be possible to personalize a lesson objective for a student's current skill level without deviating from the curricular expectation. (Doing this could be especially helpful, for example, if, as a core French teacher, you have former students of French immersion in your class.) With the objective more personalized, it could be easier to assess the student's level of performance and avoid creating unnecessary expectations for a student.
