**Prefix** *inter-*

**Pronunciation** The prefix *inter-* is pronounced as it looks: /in-ter/.

## Etymology of *inter-*

**Origin** Latin

**Meaning** among; between

**Example: internet** Look at the word **internet**. In this word, *net* is short for *network*. If the prefix *inter-* means “among or between,” then the word **internet** means “among or between networks.”

# INTERCONNECTED

Can you imagine the world without the **internet**? Computers and networks are **interconnected**. Thanks to the **internet**, we can **interact** with people all over the world. We can also shop, connect with wildlife through live cams, watch videos, and listen to music. One of the most common uses of the **internet** is to find information. When we search for something online, we are using what is known as a search engine.

## Meet Alan Emtage

Alan Emtage is a computer scientist. He created the world's first **internet** search engine in 1989. The search engine was called ARCHIE. Many of today's powerful search engines use the ideas that Emtage first developed.

Emtage was born in Barbados. He moved to Canada to attend McGill University in Montréal, Québec. He studied computer science at university. He was still a student when he made the first version of his search engine. Emtage now lives and works in the United States.

Emtage is an **internationally** recognized computer scientist. He has also been inducted into the **Internet** Hall of Fame!



## Did You Know?

The **Internet** Hall of Fame was started in 2012. It honours people from around the world who have helped develop the **internet**, from its earliest days to today. Members include engineers, computer scientists, educators, security experts, and many others.
