ALL 5 AREAS OF KNOWLEDGE ARE NOW COMPULSORY

Choice of 2 of 5 optional themes

- Knowledge and Technology,
- Knowledge and Language,
- Knowledge and Indigenous Societies,
- Knowledge and Politics,
- Knowledge and Religion

New compulsory core theme *Knowledge and the Knower*

Students will not be expected to formulate their own knowledge questions for assessments.

Finally, there will be more effective teacher support provided to deliver the new TOK course.

New compulsory knowledge framework

- Scope
- Perspectives
- Methods and tools
- Ethics

Ethics will become a continuous thread that runs throughout the new course. It will become compulsory but will no longer be a standalone AOK.

New assessment

The essay will remain...

however titles will become more accessible, and viewed as pre-set knowledge questions.

New exhibition internal assessment replacing the presentation

Students select a knowledge question from a list of prompts and curate an exhibition of three 'objects'.

Students provide commentaries about how their objects show the manifestation of their knowledge question in the world.

Commentaries will be moderated.

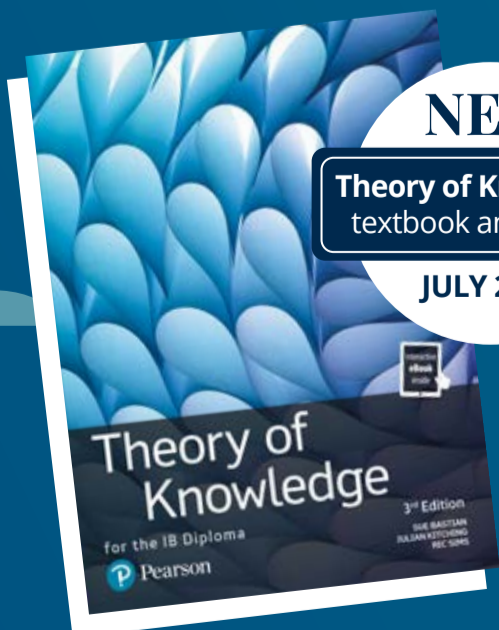
