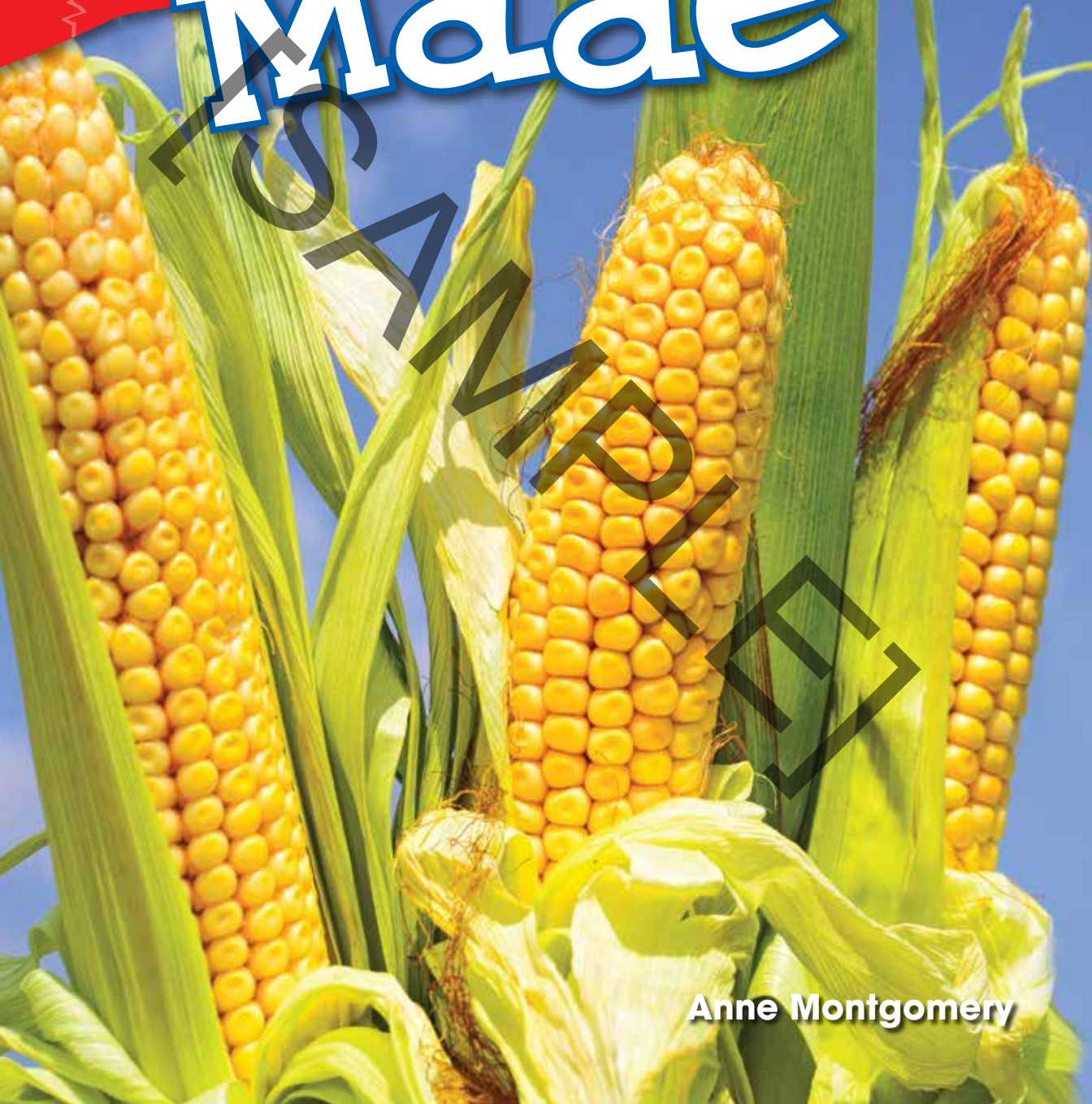
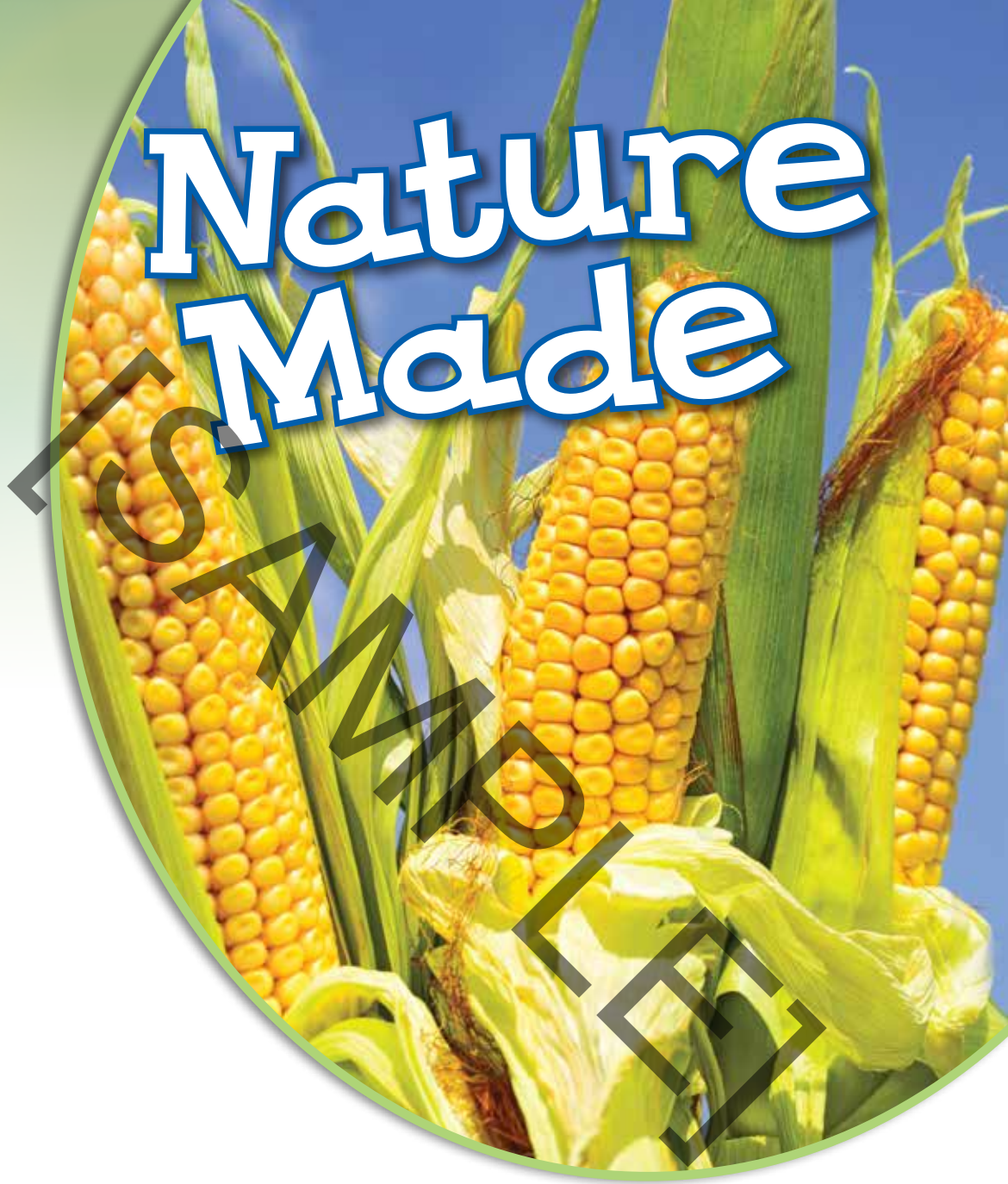

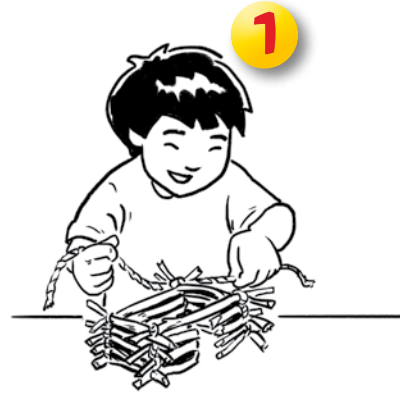
What to Get
