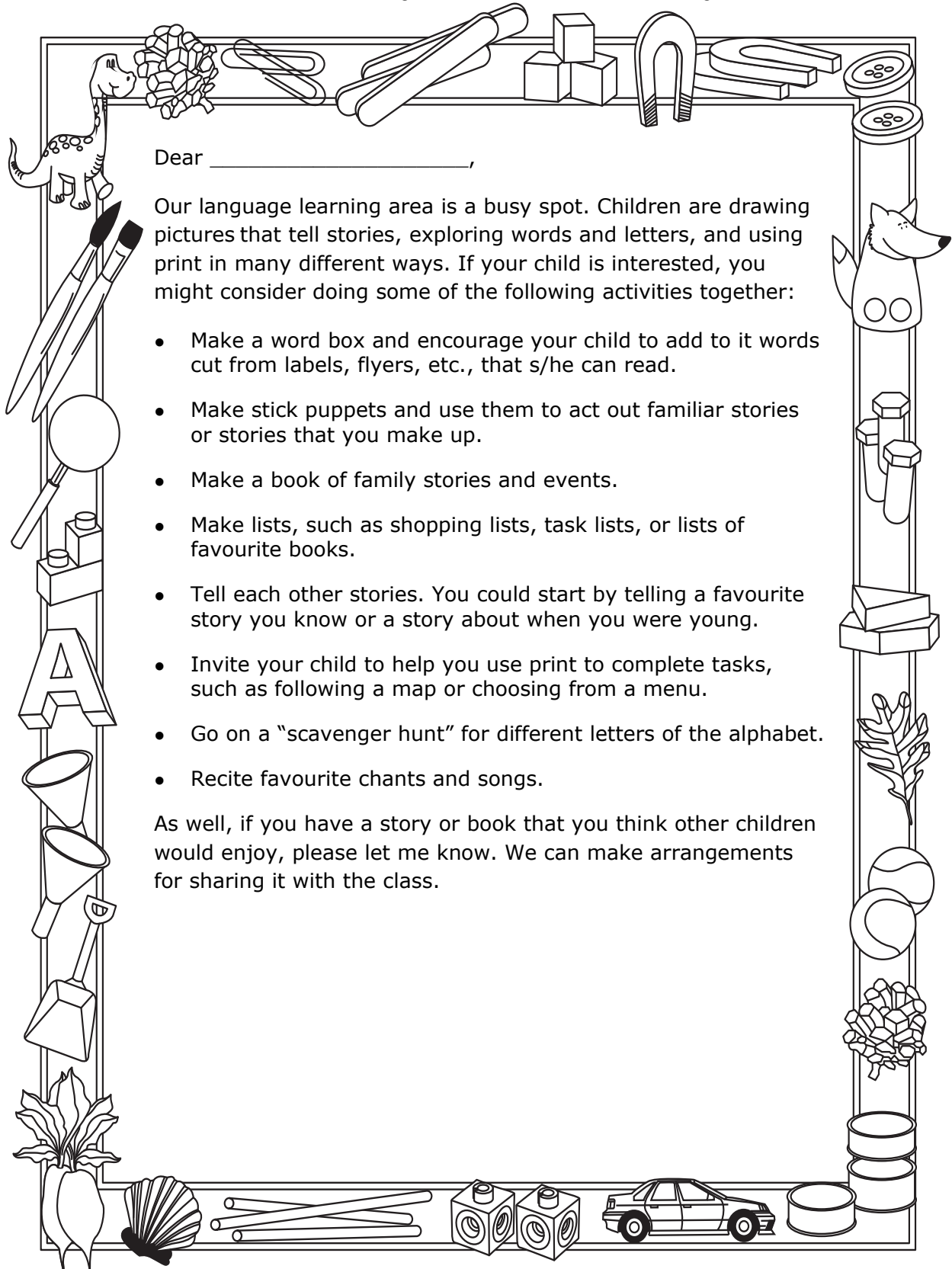

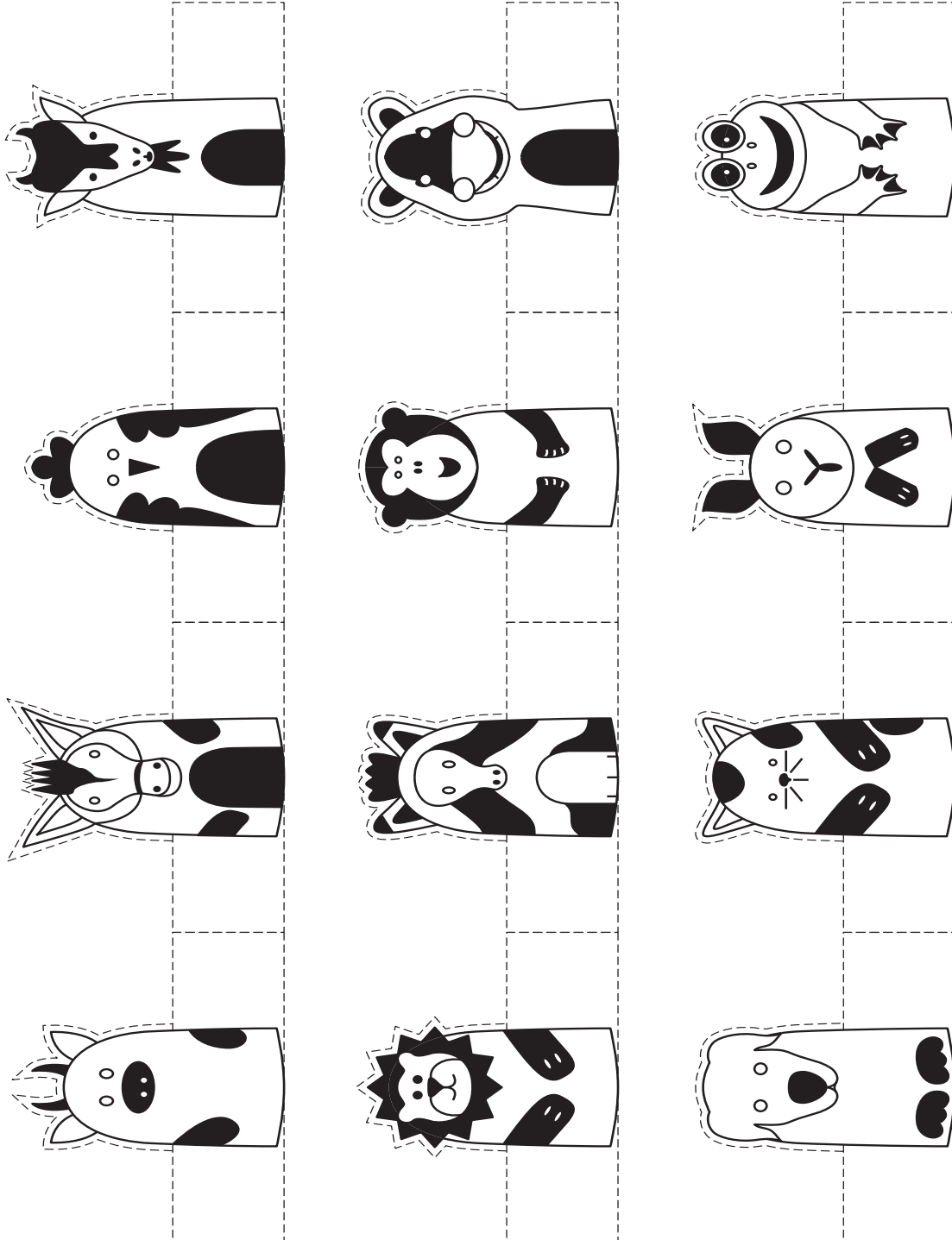
- Make a word box and encourage your child to add to it words cut from labels, flyers, etc., that s/he can read.
- Make stick puppets and use them to act out familiar stories or stories that you make up.
- Make a book of family stories and events.
- Make lists, such as shopping lists, task lists, or lists of favourite books.
- Tell each other stories. You could start by telling a favourite story you know or a story about when you were young.
- Invite your child to help you use print to complete tasks, such as following a map or choosing from a menu.
- Go on a "scavenger hunt" for different letters of the alphabet.
- Recite favourite chants and songs.
