Zoom In: Sacramental Content in the Program

Hello and welcome! In this video, we will take a closer look at the sacramental content in the program.

From the home page, select "Sacramental Content" from the navigational menu at the top of the page.

Preparing for the Sacraments

The sacramental content identified in this chart is integrated throughout the *Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ* Religious Education program for schools. On this page, content from the program that pertains to Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, and Reconciliation has been organized into four menu tabs. Select any sacrament to access Student Book and Big Book pages, Posters, videos, songs, online activities, and work sheets that discuss or support learning about that sacrament.

Please note that the resources listed here do not stand alone and are not a suitable replacement for a sacramental preparation program.

Let's say you'd like to watch a video that supports learning about the Eucharist. First, select "Eucharist" from the four menu tabs. Find entries under the "Videos" heading and select any of the links to open the video in a modal window. Select the play button to start the video. Closed captioning, transcripts, and other tools for accessibility are available within the modal window. Select "Close" or click away from the modal window to return to the sacramental content page.

Let's try another example. Select "Baptism" from the four menu tabs. Find the entries under the "Activities" heading. Select any activity to open it in a new browser tab or window. These online

activities can be used to support learning and assess students' understanding of sacramental content in the program. Use the "School and Home Tip" for guidance on how to use each activity fully and effectively. Simply close the activity to return to the sacramental content page.
