## **Content**

Students are expected to know the following:

- ❖ The meaning of the four marks of the Church: One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic and how these four marks are lived out in the life of the Church. [CCC nos. 811-945]
- The Church, in celebrating the Liturgy and the Sacraments participates in the work of the Holy Trinity. [CCC nos. 1077-1209]
- The important roles of Scripture (i.e., Word of God, Jesus Christ), the Church (i.e., Teaching Magisterium) and the Holy Spirit in the formation of a healthy (upright) conscience. [CCC nos. 1776-1802]
- The grace received through the Holy Spirit calls us to holiness and gives us the gifts we need to be justified in the Christian life (i.e., to manifest the excellent work of God's love). [CCC nos. 1810-1811; 1830-1832; 1987-2029]
- How the Holy Spirit, through the communion of saints, guides, teaches, and inspires the Church to a communion of holiness. [CCC nos. 687-747; 823-829]
- The principles of responsibility and participation in society are Christian social virtues, which call us to roles of leadership, and to evangelize through our witness of the Gospel and the promotion of social justice in the world. [CCC nos. 1877-1948]
- ❖ The mission of the Church, as animated by the Holy Spirit, is focused on sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with all people of the earth. [CCC nos. 830-856]
